

KEY FIGURES: EPICO AT THE PALACE OF MAINTENON, FRANCE

HISTORY:

Documented since the 13th century, the Palace of Maintenon has always been increased and embellished by its successive owners, particularly by Madame de Maintenon, Louis XIV's second wife. Kept within a single family since the end of the 17th century, the castle was bequeathed to the Mansart Foundation in 1983 by the Raindres family, heirs of the Noailles family. Since 2005, the Eure-et-Loir Departmental Council has managed the site and the collections.

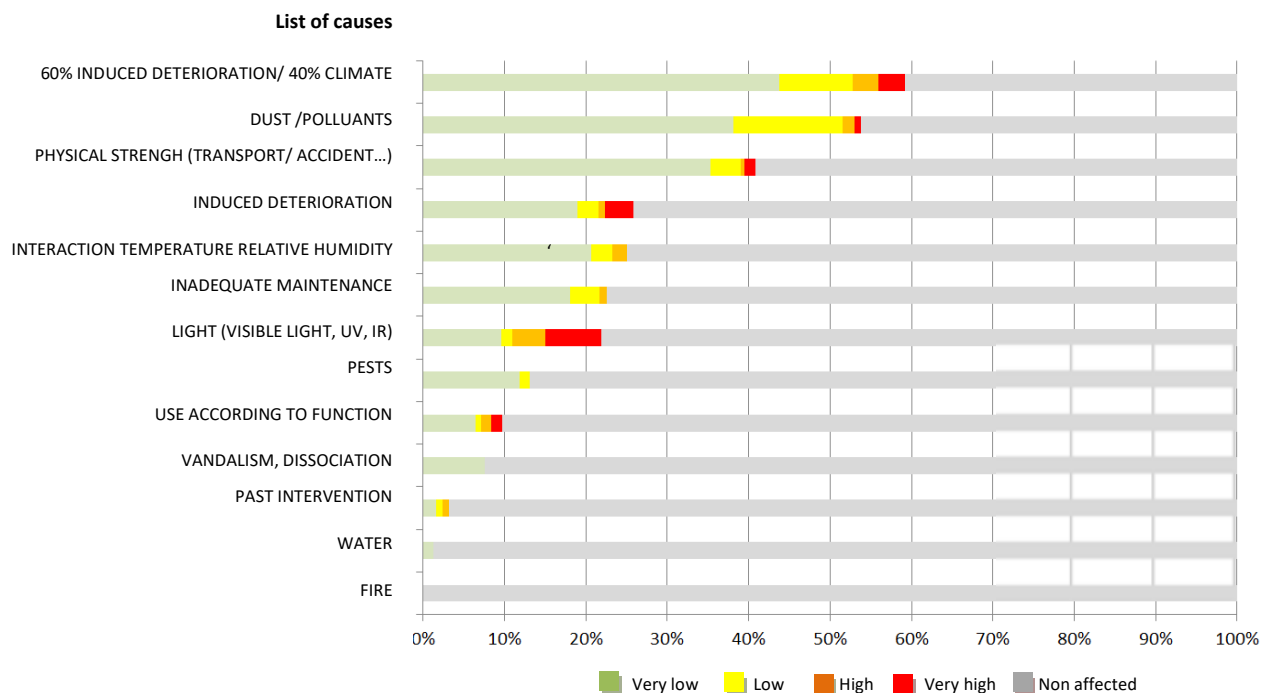
Assessment steps	Time needed (for 2 people)
Preparing condition report tools in the office and on location (The trial inspection, Pre-inspection sheet, zoning, sampling)	6 days
Data collecting on location	7 days
Data treatment in the office	4 days
Results interpretation and recommendations	2 days
Total for 23 rooms	19 days

RESULTS:

-1500 Total number of inventoried work → 93 objects in the EPICO sample
(confidence level = 95%; margin of error 10%)
-23 selected Rooms → 14 Zones
-548 damage causes founded
-3 major causes: 60% Inherent degradation-40% climate, Dust-Polluants,
Physical forces

RANKING: alteration cause impact (objects affected by causes + scale of damage):



MULTICRITERIA ZONING:

Zoning makes it possible to group rooms with similar characteristics (museography, type of visit, activities (film shoots events...), human impact and orientation) with have similar impact on the collection.
